President Soltz's Charge to the MSCHE Steering Work Groups

The Middles States Commission on Higher Education accreditation process has significantly changed since our last decennial self-study in 2008-2009. In addition to the newly revised MSCHE Standards, this review involves a three-year process culminating in the submission of our self-study report and the site visit in 2018-2019.
