Components of the Degree Audit

University Requirements contains policies that apply to every undergraduate student:

- Minimum GPA of 2.0 or better for good academic standing. ALL courses are used in this calculation. Students in the College of Education require a 3.0 to maintain good academic standing.
- Residency Rule; 30 of the last 45 units must be earned at Bloom U.
- 4 Year Rule; 60 units must be earned at a 4 year institution.
- Minimum Units; AT LEAST 120 units must be earned for the Bachelors. Some Plans require more than 120.

Major Requirements contains courses required by the major:

- Major required courses; those courses that must be taken and successfully completed.
- Major elective courses; courses the student must take but may choose from several approved by the department.
- Major GPA; this is the last line in the Major Requirements and has been configured using standards set by the department. Only courses designated by the department are included in this calculation.

General Education Requirements:

- Gen Eds for students PRIOR to Fall 2012 will consist of the Specific and the Distribution Requirements.
- Gen Eds for incoming Fall 2012 freshman and all new freshman moving forward will consist of the ten Goals.

Free Electives:

- Free Electives courses are those courses needed to bring the student up to 120 units required to graduate after the major and general education requirements have been met. The number of units will vary by major and not all majors will require Free Electives.

Courses Not Used:

- Courses not used and courses not eligible contain courses the student attempted but either withdrew from or failed, developmental courses that may not count toward graduation or courses taken and passed that can't be used to satisfy any requirement.
- Click on collapse all for a cleaner view of the interactive report. You may then expand the sections one at a time.
