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Distribution Requirements (36 Credit Hours)

A. Humanities (12 Cr.) Select from the approved general education courses of at least three (3) different departments: Art (30, 31, 32), Music (35), Theater (26), English (20), History (42), Languages & Cultures (10-18), Philosophy (28), Mass Communications (27), and Communication Studies (25). No more than 3 credits in history can be counted.

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B. Social Sciences (12 Cr.) Select from the approved general education courses of at least (3) different departments: Anthropology (46), Economics (40), Geography (41), Political Science (44), Psychology (48), and Sociology (45), Criminal Justice (43), and Social Work (49). **(Geography=Dept 41 has been renamed as EGGS)**

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C. Natural Sciences & Mathematics (12 Cr.) Select from the approved general education courses of at least three (3) different departments: Biology & Allied Health (50), Chemistry (52), Earth Science (51), Mathematics (53) and Physics (54). **(Geoscience or Earth Science=Dept 51 has been renamed as EGGS)**

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¹ Select one of the following: either a Communication Elective (B); Quantitative & Analytical (C); or Values, Ethics & Responsible Decision Making (D) to also count towards the appropriate Distribution Requirements A, B, or C (usually students make the Quantitative & Analytical count twice).
