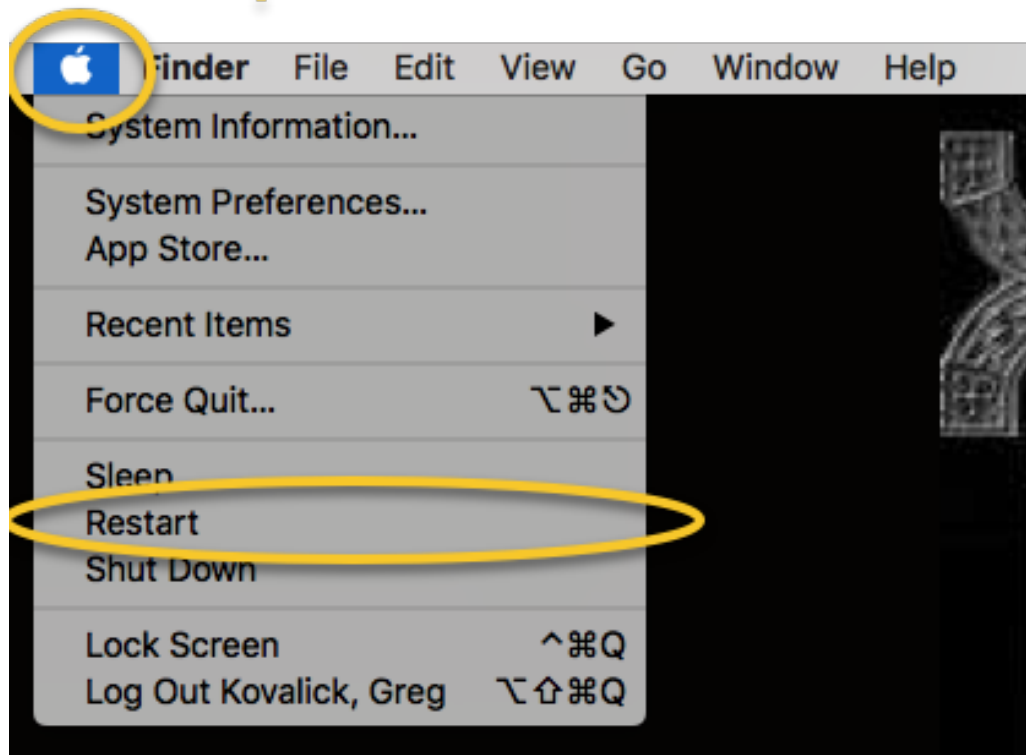


Steps to Change your Network Password on a Mac

1) Restart your Mac



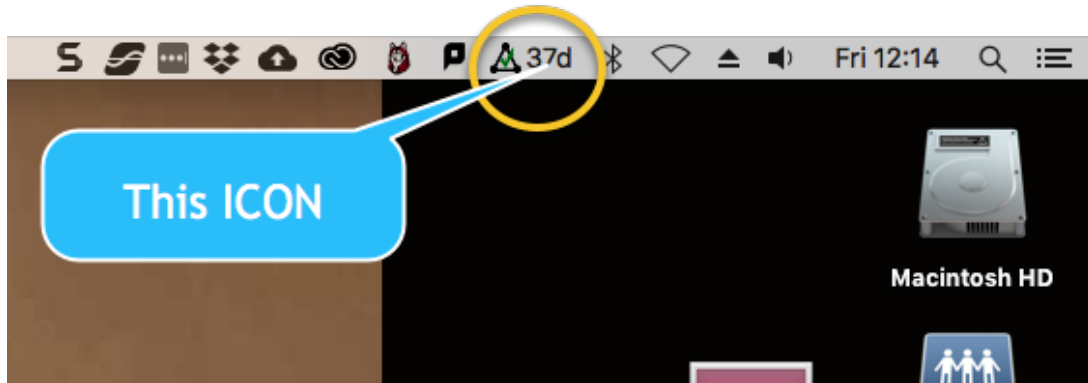

2) Plug your Mac into a Bloomsburg University wired network connection

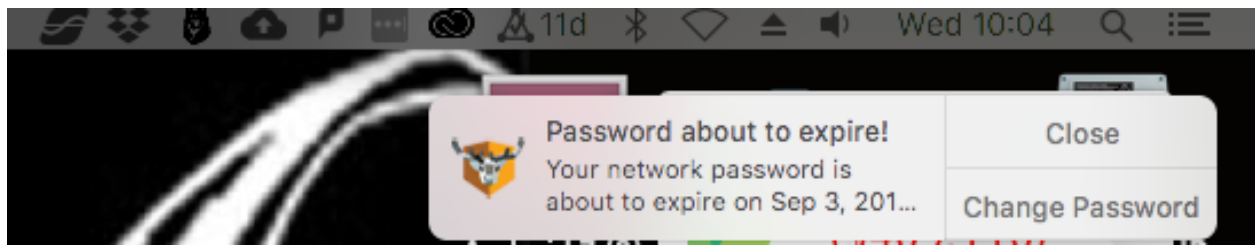
a) Make sure you hear it click when you plug in the cable.

3) Sign back in using your existing password

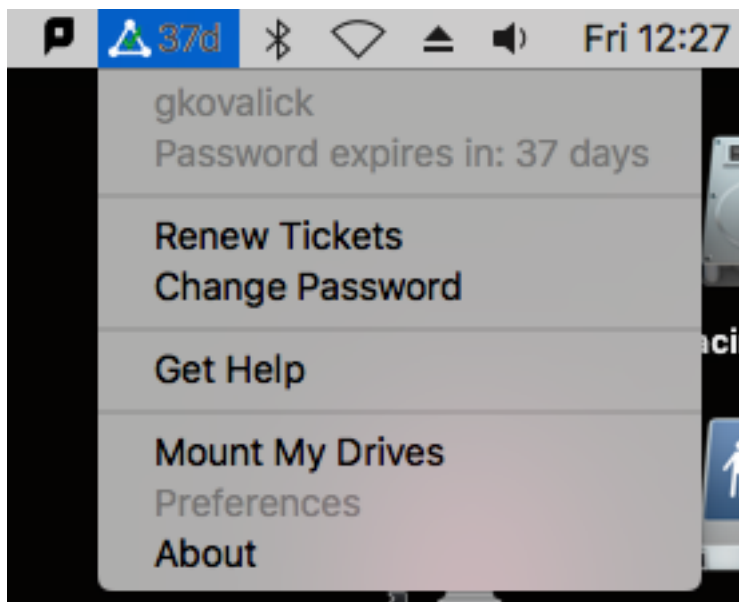
4) Look for this Icon by your Clock



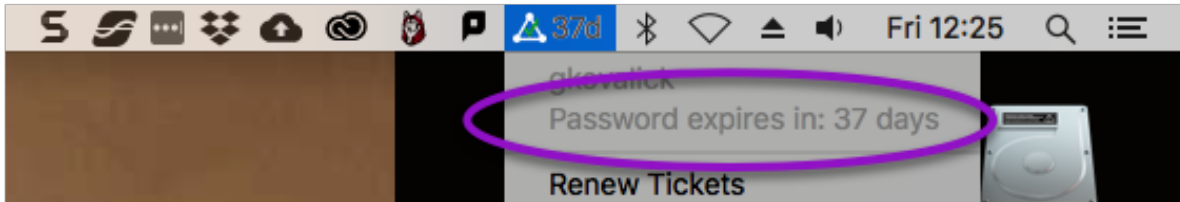
5) It may also look like this



6) Click On It (You will see this screen)

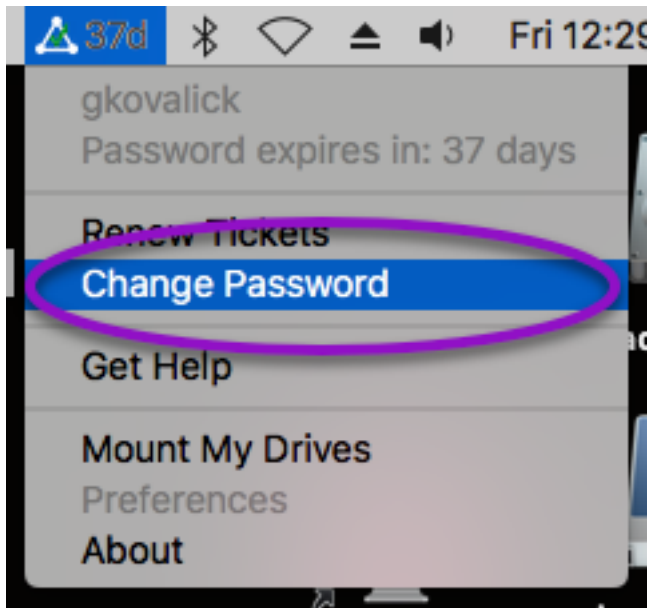


7) The 2nd line tells you how many days you have left with that current password.



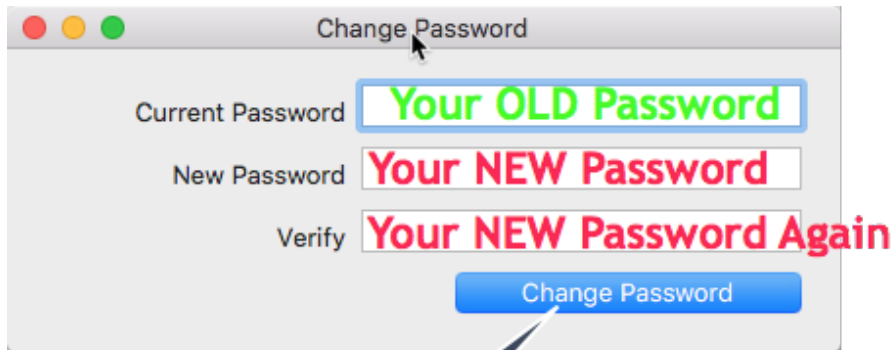

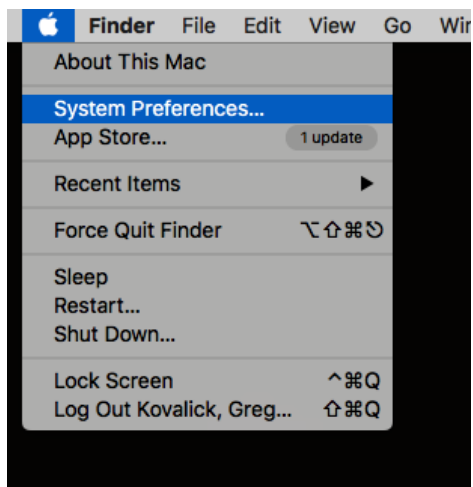
9) Fill out the following Information, then click “Change Password”

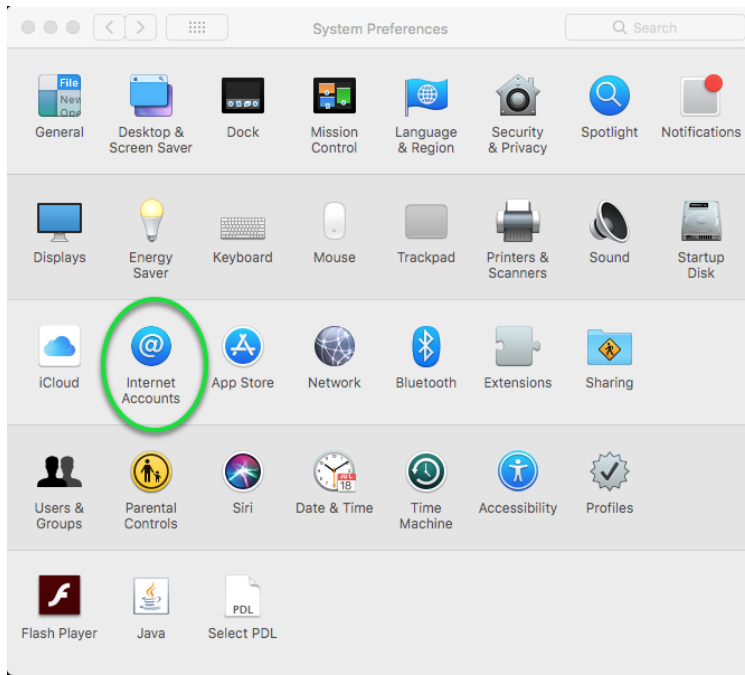
10) This will update your Keychain, Mail & Calendar passwords.

11) To verify that this updated successfully, click on the Apple Logo and go to System Preferences.



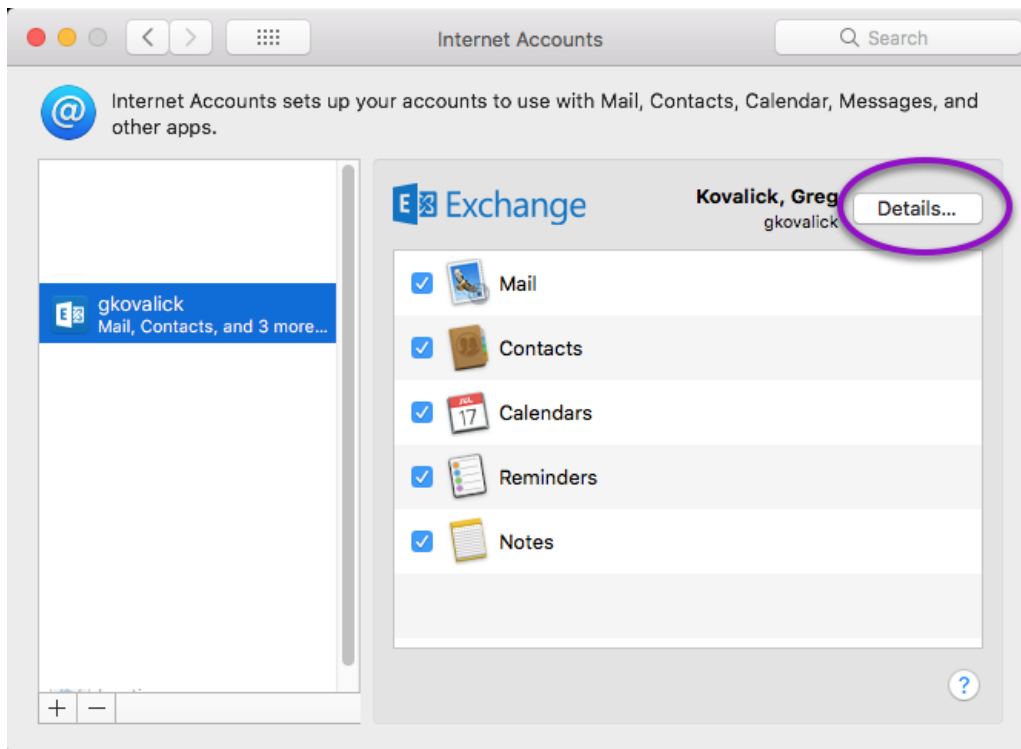

12) Select Internet Accounts



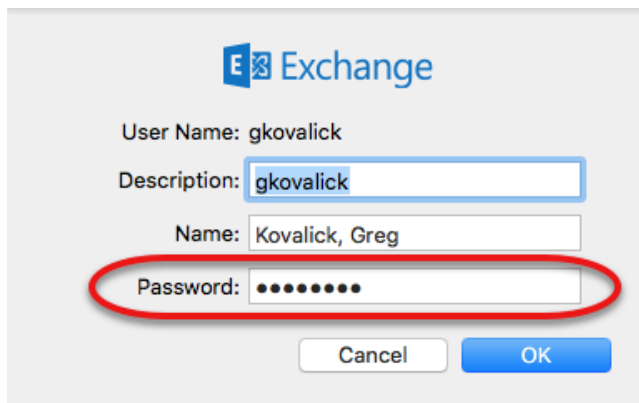

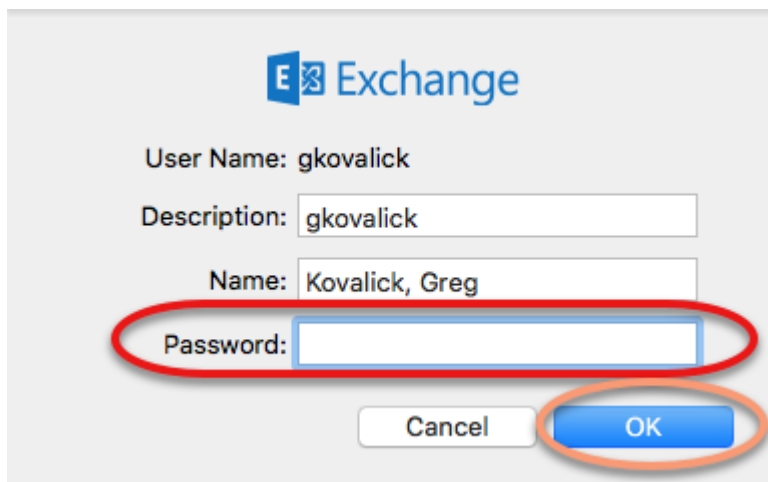
14) If the Password Field has something in there, your password has updated
